CHRISTMAS 2018 CELEBRATING THE BIRTH OF CHRIST

God's Predetermined Plan
Isaiah 7:14; Galatians 4:4-5; Philippians 2:6-8
Luke 2:1-38

The *God* is *glorified* when a Christian believer begins to *grow* and *mature* into the very *likeness* and *image* of Christ. Over the next couple of weeks, we are going to see how God planned His glory to be *revealed* to the world today...through the *transforming power of God's grace* in those *redeemed* by His Son, Jesus Christ. This is God's Christmas gift to man.

Let's see how God's *predetermined plan* was *revealed*:

"Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel."

~Isaiah 7:14

"But when the fullness of the time came, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman, born under the Law, so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons."

~Galatians 4:4-5

"Although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

~Philippians 2:6-8

I. GOD'S PURPOSE:

• **Redemption**...Christ's saving work...the payment for the sinner's debt.

"For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

~Romans 6:23

Redemption is a *ransom* for the sinner to be *released* from their *bondage* to sin and to Satan.

"...Zacharias was filled with the Holy Spirit, and prophesied, saying, 'Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, for He has visited us and accomplished redemption for His people, and has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of David His servant'."

~Luke 1:67-69

"(Anna) at that very moment...came up and began giving thanks to God, and continued to speak of Him to all those who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem."

~Luke 2:38

"In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace."

~Ephesians 1:7

• Reconciliation...The *removal of enmity* (hostility, antagonism, and rebellion) *and the restoration of fellowship between man and God*. Man is no longer *separated* from God by sin, but completely *restored* and *reconciled* back to God.

"Therefore if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come. Now all these things are from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, that

God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and He has committed to us the word of reconciliation."

~II Corinthians 5:17-19

• **Resurrection**...Victory over *sin* and *death*.

Luke 24:1-12

I Corinthians 15:12-19

"...I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me will live even if he dies."

~John 11:25

Redemption and **reconciliation** were only possible through Christ's **resurrection**...*victory* over *sin* and *death*.

II. GOD'S PROCLAMATION: God *announcing* and *declaring* His *predetermined plan*.

Three titles are given to Jesus...Luke 2:11

• Savior...

"For my eyes have seen Your salvation."

~Luke 2:30

"...Behold, the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"

~John 1:29

"There is salvation in no one else; for there is no other name under heaven that has been given among men by which we must be saved."

~Acts 4:12

"Jesus said... 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me."

~John 14:6

"For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God;"

~Ephesians 2:8

• **Christ**...Messiah, the anointed One.

"And there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon...And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ."

~Luke 2:25a-26

"Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

~Matthew 16:16

• Lord...Yahweh, or God.

"Jesus said, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' (The blind man who healed) answered, 'Who is He, Lord, that I may believe in Him?' Jesus said to him, 'You have both seen Him, and He is the one who is talking with you.' And he said, 'Lord, I believe.' And he worshiped Him."

~John 9:35b-38

"To the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen."

~Jude 24

This is an *incredible statement* considering that **Jude** was the *half-brother* of Jesus.

"And on His robe and on His thigh He has a name written, 'KING OF KINGS, AND LORD OF LORDS'."

~Revelation 19:16

III. GOD'S PRESENCE: The *omnipresence* of God. Now, the *third person* of the Trinity *dwells* with believers *continually*.

"Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body."

~I Corinthians 6:19-20

• Immanuel...God with us. (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23) "Therefore the Lord Himself will give you a sign: Behold, a virgin will be with child and bear a son, and she will call His name Immanuel."

~Isaiah 7:14

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and shall bear a Son, they shall call His name Immanuel, which translated means, God with us."

~Matthew 1:23

• Revelation...God revealed Himself to man.

"It had been revealed to him (Simeon) by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ."

~Luke 2:26

"A Light of revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel."

~Luke 2:32

• Sustainment...God's promises to be present.

"...I will be with you; I will not fail you or forsake you."

~Joshua 1:5

"He Himself has said, 'I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you'..."

~Hebrews 13:5

LESSONS WE CAN LEARN:

- For every one who belongs to Jesus, Christmas is a
 wonderful time to express our gratitude for the
 "unspeakable gift" of His Son (II Corinthians 9:15). If
 we will make this the standard by which we measure
 every celebration opportunity this holiday season, we will
 find a profound measure of Godly joy and satisfaction.
- The Christmas story is more than a story of Jesus' birth. It's also the story of His <u>death</u> and <u>resurrection</u>. After all, He didn't come simply to make us feel good...nor did He come as a political figure; Jesus came to conquer sin and evil itself!
