## INFINITE...YET INTIMATE Four Great Attributes Of God Psalm 139

The greatness of God is infinitely vast. Yet this infinite God is intimately aware of every individual on the face of the earth. In the midst of over 7.5 billion people (and counting) on the earth, God knows each and every one of us perfectly. The Bible says that the very hairs of our heads are numbered. He knows what each person will say before we say it. He is present everywhere and personally involved at even the most minute level. Having created every life, God presides over every aspect of each of these lives. Every thought, attitude, word, and deed is an open book before Him. How can a God so immense be so immanent? Such is the mind-boggling yet soul-comforting reality about our infinite yet intimate God.

**Psalm 139** is a *wisdom psalm...intensely personal*, written by **David**. It reveals the *awe* and *wonder* he felt towards God... the God who *created* the *heavens* and the *earth*, yet who *actually knew* him and was *intimately involved* in *every detail* of his life. This *psalm* describes some of the *most unique attributes* of God...His *omniscience*, *omnipresence*, *omnipotence*, *holy* and *eternal nature*. **David** sees them not as mere *theological ideas* or *thoughts...*but as *dynamic realities* that *deeply impacted* his life...what gives him *hope* and *security*.

Here is a *personal testimony* by this beloved man of God...a man after God's own heart. It surveys *four great divine* attributes which should influence every believer's life today. **David** meditates upon the crucial truths that God is all-knowing, all-present, all-powerful, and all-holy.

- I. GOD IS ALL-KNOWING: (vs. 1-6) Omniscience...His knowledge of all things.
  - O Lord, You have searched me and known me (vs. 1)...

**Searched**...used to describe *the careful scrutiny involved in mining operations* and *in exploring a country*.

**David** realized that *nothing* in his life was *hidden* from God's *penetrating knowledge*...that God had *scoured every detail* of his life and *knew* him *intimately*.

You know when I sit down and when I rise up; You understand my thought from afar (vs. 2)...

These *two activities* are intended to represent **David's** *every day activities*. Not only does God know his *actions*, but He *knows his thoughts* and *sees into his heart*.

You scrutinize my path and my lying down, and are intimately acquainted with all my ways. Even before there is a word on my tongue, behold, O Lord, You know it all (vs. 3-4)...

Scrutinize...means to sift through something...to winnow as grain...to sort out...to look at thoroughly and critically.

**Intimately acquainted**...God was *deeply familiar* with all his ways. He even *knew* what he was *going to say* before he *said it*. **David** could *only conclude*...You know it all.

You have enclosed me behind and before, and laid Your hand upon me (vs. 5)...

Enclosed...means that there is no means of escape. God surrounded David like a city being besieged with no way of escape. There was no way for him to escape God's all-knowing thoughts.

Laid Your hand upon me...God had His hand on David ...He was always near. It's the picture of someone taking hold of a blind man and safely leading him.

Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is too high, I cannot attain to it (vs. 6)...God's *omniscience* is both *convicting* and *comforting*. It's *humbling* beyond one's *capacity to grasp*.

Too wonderful...God's omniscience surpasses human ability to comprehend it.

"Do you know about the layers of the thick clouds, the wonders of one perfect in knowledge..."

~Job 37:16

"For the ways of a man are before the eyes of the Lord, and He watches all his paths."

~Proverbs 5:21

It's like a parent having eyes in the back of their head. It amazes children when their parents know what they have done. They thought that they had gotten away with it.

II. GOD IS ALL-PRESENT: (vs. 7-12) Omnipresence...His presence everywhere. Emmanuel...God with us.

Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? If I ascend to heaven, You are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, behold, You are there (vs. 7-8)...

**David** *understood* that God is *all-present*...and that he *could never escape* His *divine presence*.

He asked *two rhetorical questions*...and they imply a *negative answer*. There is *nowhere* God *isn't present*.

If I ascend to heaven, You are there...

If I make my bed in Sheol, behold, You are there... Sheol...a reference to the *dead* or the *grave*. Even the *abode of the dead isn't apart* from God's *omnipresence*.

"For to this end Christ died and lived again, that He might be Lord both of the dead and of the living."

~Romans 14:9

If I take the wings of the dawn, if I dwell in the remotest part of the sea, even there Your hand will lead me, and Your right hand will lay hold of me (vs. 9-10)...

North, south, east, and west are all represented here. No matter where one goes in life, God's hand is there to lead us. We are never beyond God's divine reach.

Will lead me...means to direct or guide someone down the right path...down the path of righteousness. Nowhere is this verb more vividly demonstrated than in the Book of Exodus where God led Israel with a cloud by day and fire by night (Exodus 13:21).

If I say, "Surely the darkness will overwhelm me, and the light around me will be night," even the darkness is not dark to You, and the night is as bright as the day. Darkness and light are alike to You (vs. 11-12)...

God's all-seeing eyes can penetrate even the darkness. Dark times are light to God. He is present in them, knowing perfectly all that is transpiring and what His eternal purposes are.

"I permitted Myself to be sought by those who did not ask for Me; I permitted Myself to be found by those who did not seek Me. I said, 'Here am I, here am I,' to a nation which did not call on My name. I have spread out My hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in the way which is not good, following their own thoughts..."

~Isaiah 65:1-2

**Isaiah** reminds us that *God is here for us*. It's remarkable to think that even when we are *ignoring* Him, *distracted* by our *lives*, *social media*, *stress*, *pressures*, *networking*, or trying to *impress others*, *not really aware* of Him or, perhaps, *not even interested*...that He is *available* for us. *Relationally*, *desirous* for us to be *with* Him. To *hear* Him. To *respond* to Him in conversation, with our lives.

"The eyes of the Lord are in every place, watching the evil and the good."

"'Am I a God who is near,' declares the Lord, 'And not a God far off? Can a man hide himself in hiding places so I do not see him?' declares the Lord. 'Do I not fill the heavens and the earth?' declares the Lord."

~Jeremiah 23:23-24

I used to tell the boys that there was no place they could go, or do anything that I wouldn't know about (Jefferson and J. Clyde Morris Blvd.)

III. GOD IS ALL-POWERFUL: (vs. 13-18) Omnipotence ... His power in the formation of man.

For You formed my inward parts; You wove me in my mother's womb (vs. 13)...

Formed...means to acquire by creation...molded like a skilled artist would form a pot out of clay or one would weave a beautiful tapestry.

**Inward parts**...refers to all the *organs*, *muscles*, *nerves*, etc...*skillfully made*.

I will give thanks to You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; wonderful are Your works, and my soul knows it very well (vs. 14)...

**Fearfully and wonderfully made...David** *praised* God for this display of perfect *omnipotence*...a response of *awe* and *wonder* towards God who *created* him so *perfectly*.

My frame was not hidden from You, when I was made in secret, and skillfully wrought in the depths of the earth (vs. 15)...

My frame...refers to his bones or skeleton.

**Not hidden from You**...in *full view* to *divine eyes*. Even though **made in secret** (in the *mother's womb*)...he wasn't **hidden** from God. *Concealed* from *human eyes* but *not from* God.

**Skillfully wrought**...means woven together like fine needlepoint.

Your eyes have seen my unformed substance; and in Your book were all written the days that were ordained for me, when as yet there was not one of them (vs. 16)...

**Unformed substance**...refers to the *embryo*.

All written the days that were ordained for me...The span of his life...the precise length of his life...was determined by God before he was born.

How precious also are Your thoughts to me, O God! How vast is the sum of them! If I should count them, they would outnumber the sand. When I awake, I am still with You (vs. 17-18)...

This led **David** to conclude that the Lord's *plans* for His people are *most precious* and in fact are *innumerable*. These *divine truths* were beyond his *comprehension*. If he tried to *list these truths*, they would outnumber the grains of sand on the beaches of the world...*surpassing* the *ability* for anyone to *count* or *comprehend*.

When I awake, I am still with You...Each morning when he would awaken, this sense of awe continued to dominate ...he couldn't remove such towering thoughts about God from his mind.

IV. GOD IS ALL-HOLY: (vs. 19-24) Eternal...His holiness which destroys evil and searches the believer's heart.

"I, the Lord, search the heart, I test the mind..." ~Jeremiah 17:10a

O that You would slay the wicked, O God; depart from me, therefore, men of bloodshed. For they speak against You wickedly, and Your enemies take Your name in vain (vs. 19-20)...

God's *enemies* were David's *enemies*. They *blasphemed* God and *abused* His name. David *couldn't bear* this. He *desired* that God would *destroy* those who would *speak against* Him and those who *opposed* Him.

Do I not hate those who hate You, O Lord? And do I not loathe those who rise up against You? I hate them with the utmost hatred; they have become my enemies (vs. 21-22)...

David *expresses* his **hate** for those who **hate** God. This means that he *rejects* and *refuses* those who would *rise up against* God. To *oppose* God was to *oppose* David. He was so *burdened* for God's *kingdom work* to *move forward* that he asked for *all obstacles* to be *removed*, even those *adversaries*.

Search me, O God, and know my heart; try me and know my anxious thoughts; and see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way (vs. 23-24)...

In dealing with *sin*, David was *equally hard* on himself. He asked God to **search** and *examine* his own **heart**. He knew that God *knew his heart* better than he *knew his own heart*.

Try me and know my anxious thoughts...David remained in an *open*, *honest*, and *vulnerable posture*, imploring the Lord to *take a proactive role* inside him by *pointing out* or *finding* and *seeing* anything that *offends* Him. He asked God to *test* him as a *refiner* would *test* and *purify metal*.

If there be any hurtful way...Hebrew for an *idol*. In David's culture *idols* were *actual objects* that people believed *had power*, *prayed to*, *tried to appease*, and *gave authority to*, like ones for *fertility* or *nature*.

In our Western, secular culture, we don't necessarily have the same *idols* but we certainly *try to appease* and *glorify* various *objects*, *habits*, *people*, or *political beliefs*... placing them *higher than* God. If we are honest, we hope any one of these things *will save us*, *keep us happy*, *define us*, and/or *have authority* in our lives even more than our loving heavenly Father.

In this *confessional prayer*, David is *humbly* and *honestly* putting his foot down to his *behavior*, especially to his *idol worship*. Looking at the **Hebrew** in **verse 24**, the *cry of his heart* sounds something like this: *Show me my idols God...*I know they *offend* you. I know they are *keeping me from* You and You *from* me. I know they *are not* You. I need Your *help* because, God, I want You *to lead* me and *guide* me (in a governing sense) forever and ever!

## LESSONS WE CAN LEARN:

- The personal application and direct appropriation of this Psalm begins with an overwhelming sense of the INFINITE GREATNESS of God...who He is.
- As we ponder the *immensity* of His *greatness*, yet how *intimately involved* He is in a *personal relationship* with us...our hearts should be captivated, even awestruck, that He would be so <u>LOVING</u> and <u>INTIMATELY</u> involved with us.

God, who *knows* all and *controls* all. God *is* all and *in* all.

• The greater our understanding of who God is, and of His attributes, the greater will be the <u>AWE</u> and WORSHIP that will flood our hearts for Him.

It would be difficult to *adore* a God we could *completely understand*. The fact that He *exceeds the limits* of our *human comprehension* causes our *hearts to be filled* with even *greater amazement* toward Him.
