FORGIVENESS Reconcile...Showing Mercy Through Forgiveness Luke 15:11-32

One of the strongest messages presented in Scripture is *forgiveness*. The Bible is the story of how God *forgives*. It begins in **Genesis** and continues through **Revelation**. If *forgiveness* is one of the central themes...where do you suppose the *enemy might attack* you as God's children? Through *forgiveness!* When *unforgiveness* and *bitterness* rule our hearts, we are moving backwards in our relationships with people and God...and we are opening ourselves up to Satan's attack.

Christian's don't like to admit that they are *bitter*. We would rather say...*"I've been hurt"* or *"I have resentment"* or *"I have a caution or concern"*.

Forgiveness is a *choice*...not a *feeling*. It is an act of the *will*! When it comes to *forgiving* someone who has *offended* us, we must act in obedience, even when the feelings aren't there. It's forgiving *again*...*and again*...*and again*...whenever the enemy tries to bring it up...you *forgive again*!

THREE ASPECTS OF FORGIVENESS:

- <u>GETTING</u> Forgiveness.
- **<u>GIVING</u>** Forgiveness.
- Forgiving <u>YOURSELF</u>.
- I. GETTING FORGIVENESS: 3 Step Process
 - 1. ACCEPT RESPONSIBILITY FOR YOUR ACTION:
 - **REPENT**...Confess the sin.
 - Seek **RECONCILATION**...Make a decision to get it right.

- ACKNOWLEDGE that your sin was ultimately against God...but also against the person.
- Make it right at your own **EXPENSE**...*restitution*.

2. CONFESS WITHIN THE CIRCLE OF THE OFFENDED:

- **CONFRONT** the one you offended. It is better to do it face-to-face.
- **PLAN** what to say.
- Don't expect or demand a **CERTAIN RESPONSE**.
- Don't **PREACH** to them (don't try and witness to them).
- Take **PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY** for the sin.
- Find the right **TIME** and **PLACE** (God's timing).

3. DON'T USE THE WORD "IF" OR "BUT"!!!

In our culture today, when someone begins to respond to others, they typically will say..."<u>If</u> *I have offended you*" or when confronted they will say..."<u>But</u>..." and then begin to justify their actions.

Either way, what is being said is... "You say that I offended you, but I don't think that I offended you (or I don't care if I offended you)...but I'll take the 'High road' and apologize." In reality, that isn't an apology... it's justifying yourself.

Failure to seek forgiveness is the result of ...

- Lack of repentance.
- Pride (Lack of humility).

II. RESULTS OF GETTING FORGIVENESS:

• A CLEAR CONSCIENCE.

If someone you know was making a list of people who had hurt or offended them and never asked their forgiveness...would you be on that list?

"...Fight the good fight, keeping faith and a good conscience, which come have rejected and suffered shipwreck in regard to their faith."

~I Timothy 1:18-19

• A LIFSTYLE Change. (Ephesians 4:26-32)

If a change in your lifestyle doesn't take place...then getting forgiveness is just a cover for doing something you are always going to do any way. It results in a lifestyle of sin. (*Alcoholic...abuser...adultery...stealing... lying...*etc.).

- Restored WORSHIP.
- Restored **PHYSICALLY**.

"When I kept silent about my sin, my body wasted away through my groaning all day long." ~Psalm 32:3

"For my iniquities are gone over my head; as a heavy burden they weigh too much for me. My wounds grow foul and fester because of my folly. I am bent over and greatly bowed down; I go mourning all day long. For my loins are filled with burning, and there is no soundness in my flesh.
