GRACE...Living A Life Full Of Grace Hebrews 12:15; Ephesians 2:1-10

"See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble, and by it many be defiled..."

The Christian life doesn't *begin* by *grace* and then *proceed* in *our own strength*. We *begin*, *grow*, and finally *reach home* by *grace* and *grace alone*. Even though most Christians can agree with that statement *intellectually*, our *experience* often betrays a tendency toward *grace's two enemies*: *legalism* and *license*.

I have seen way too many in the church wage this *battle*. Even though a Christian from childhood, they go on to "*rededicate*" their life to Jesus again and again, never sure if their efforts at *sanctification* are enough to *keep* God's *favor*.

I've found that way to many Christians, post-conversion, tend toward *legalism* or *license* (*liberty*) in their pursuit of *sanctification*. One person I know had a strict *Independent Fundamental Reformed Baptist* background. They always tended toward *legalism*, and fought it biblically for years. Another person I know spent many years searching for joy worldly pleasures. They battled an impulse of *liberty* and *license* calling it *grace* for many years. Many pendulums swing after conversion: from *legalism* to *license*, or *vice versa*.

Personally, the church I grew up in helped me understand how to become a Christian...but it took me a lot longer to learn about the pilgrimage that follows salvation...the need for daily repentance and killing sin, praying for the fruit of the Spirit, and other crucial elements of sanctification. I lived as if justification came by grace through faith but sanctification came by law or personal effort.

My life was a frustrating merry-go-round of sin...rededication, ...law-keeping in my own strength...sin, rededication, law-

keeping...you get the picture. I felt that I had to **keep proving to God** that I was **serious** about him.

Fortunately, both **Galatians** and **Philippians** encourage us to know that by *grace*, we press on to *know God* more deeply and hold on to what we discover about Him. And *by grace*, He *opens our eyes* and *makes us grow*.

"I do not nullify the grace of God, for if righteousness comes through the Law, then Christ died needlessly."

~Galatians 2:21

The grace of God calms us, settles us, and fills us with peace. And it also raises us up to defy sin and Satan. Many of us are very accustomed to the more familiar forms of graces such as compassion, gentleness, and patience...but we can't neglect the virtue of stubborn, holy defiance either. Such defiance, strengthens us to resist temptation, reclaim enemy territory, and refuse to curse God in suffering. In Christ, we do not cower before the enemies of our soul.

It all began with **grace**...and the **Word** is full of **grace** and **truth**. The **new covenant** is a *covenant of* **grace**.

"And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. John testified about Him and cried out, saying, 'This was He of whom I said, "He who comes after me has a higher rank than I, for He existed before me." For of His fullness we have all received, and grace upon grace. For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ."

~John 1:14-17

GRACE...it isn't given for us to do what we want to do...it is given for us to do what we ought to do.

God's Desire + God's Strength = God's Will (Power) (God's Glory)

Regarding Salvation...

"So that in the ages to come He might show the surpassing riches of His grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast."

KEY FACTORS OF GRACE

• Freely given: It's a gift...it's not earned or deserved.

As we *receive* grace, we are to *give* grace also.

• **Given to all:** Given to both the saved and the unsaved.

"For the grace of God has appeared...to all men." ~Titus 2:11

"The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all. Amen."

(Last verse in the Bible)

• **Given in measure:** As we respond to grace, God gives more grace. Grace is given in degrees...we don't get it all at once. We are to grow in grace.

Romans 5:17 (abundance) Romans 5:20 (abounds) II Peter 3:18 (grow in grace) I Peter 1:2 (full measure) Ephesians 4:7

• **Sufficient for every situation:** Given according to the need of the moment.(Dying grace on dying days)

• Grace can be resisted and rejected:

"See to it that no one comes short of the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springing up causes trouble, and by it many be defiled."

Stubbornness...(Romans 2:5)

Pride...(Psalms and **Proverbs...I John 2:16**, one of three root sins)

Hard-hearted...(Ephesians 4:18)

Calloused heart...(Ephesians 4:19)

Seared conscience...(I Timothy 4:2)

• Grace requires humility: (James 4:6; Matthew 5:5; I Peter 5:5)

Humility...A wise person recognizing his true condition before God...and in need of God's grace.

Humiliation...A proud person being embarrassed...and rejecting God's grace.
